Who invented the internet?

- Who invented the Internet?
- J.C.R. Licklider of MIT is credited for the initial vision of the internet which he called the "Galactic Network". He imagined a network of interconnected computers all quickly accessing data and programs from any connected site.

The birth of the Internet

- In 1969 the first 4 host computers were connected forming the ARPANET (advanced research projects agency).
 This small group of computers was the beginning of the Internet.
- The ARPANET was first demonstrated to the public in 1972. It was received with great excitement. The first application available was email.

What is the Internet?

- Today's Internet is a network of interconnected computers via servers, usually through an ISP (Internet Service Provider).
- The servers can be anywhere in the world and can contain information ranging from the rate of the destruction of the Amazon forest to what's the #1 hit record today.

How big is the Internet today?

- In the beginning, the Internet consisted of 4 computers with limited applications.
- Ex. email
- Today, the Internet hosts millions of computers and is growing at an exponential rate.
- The applications available today have grown from just the old stand-by email, to online shopping, chat rooms, news, and the list goes on and on. There are over 450,000 domain names in the US alone!

How many people use the Internet today?

- The number grows everyday, but it is estimated that approximately 47.5 million people use the Internet in the US alone.
- Over 165 countries are connected to the Internet.

What are the potential uses of the Internet?

- The Internet was initially created for the following uses:
- 1. Military use
- 2. Sharing of information and data
- The internet today has been largely abandoned by the military but has numerous uses:
- 1.person-to-person communication (like email and chat rooms)
- 2. Education and research
- 3. Shopping
- 4. Advertising
- 5. Medical information
- 6. Government information and connection to your elected officials.
- 7. Entertainment such as games
